They do not take medical insurance, and out of pocket is \$24/hr with a minimum of four hours. They can sometimes work with veteran benefits and long term care insurance. They can be there from four hours a week to 24/7, there are no limitations aside from the minimum. There are no limits really on the care they provide- they can lift up to 25lbs, do housekeeping, bathing, cooking, transportation, companionship, etc.

They do not take medical insurance/medicare/medicaid but can work with long term care insurance, although private pay is typically what they accept. They have a minimum of 12 hrs/week broken down into 3 four hour days. They offer the same services as Visiting Angels. I was told that while the base rate is around \$28/hr, it really depends on the type of services you are looking for and that you would need to speak with their client care coordinator, Ashley, to really know how much it would cost.

They only accept long term care insurance, otherwise it's private pay. Base rate varies from \$25-30 depending on needs but never exceeds \$30/hr. They have a minimum of four hours per day, one day per week. The only services they do not provide are medical- so they cannot administer medications, do wound care, etc. They can remind clients it is time to take medicine but cannot do any more than that.

They only accept long term care insurance, otherwise it's private pay. Base rate varies from \$27 (companionship only) to \$30/per hour depending on the level of care needed. There is a minimum of 18 hours a week split into three six-hour days. They cannot administer medications. They do have a nurse on staff that can set up meds and they can remind clients, but nothing more than that!
